How do the Legacy Band Boosters financially support the Legacy Band Program?

The Legacy Band Boosters provide many more services than the district can fund. In order to cover the cost of these services, the Boosters raise money to cover these expenses. The Boosters fund the Legacy Band Program by:

- **Legacy Marching Festival:** We are honored to have the opportunity to host excellent bands from around the state at our own Marching Festival in September, and we can't succeed without our fantastic parent volunteers who pitch in for this one special day each fall.
- **King Soopers Community Rewards Program:** You and your family can immediately start earning money for our Band program by simply linking your Loyalty number or Alternative ID to Legacy HS Band Boosters (TD003). Visit <https://www.kingsoopers.com/i/community/community-rewards> and click "Get Started" under Link Your Shopper's Card. This is an easy way to help our band program with only an initial setup!!
- **Corporate Sponsorships:** We are always looking for businesses that want to support our program! Some corporations also match nonprofit donations made by employees, so see if your company offers this! Legacy Band Boosters is a registered 501(c)(3) nonprofit.
- **Tag Day:** In August, students go to different neighborhoods in Legacy boundaries asking for donations. It's a great way to interact with our community!
- **Craft Fair:** Before the winter holidays, vendors come to Legacy to sell goods. Friends and neighbors can shop for holiday gifts!
- **Mattress Fundraiser:** You've probably seen our students dancing on the corner of Zuni and 136th Avenue in mattress costumes each April or May to entice customers to this unique fundraiser. Friends and family get excellent deals on high quality mattresses and bedding, and we get great commissions to add to our fundraising income.
- **RMPA/RMCGA Shows:** Similar to the Legacy Marching Festival, sometimes we host Winter Percussion (RMPA) and Winter Guard (RMCGA) competitions.
- **Student Fundraising Goal (FRG):** We ask every student to financially contribute annually to the Legacy Band Program. The FRG can either be paid to the band directly or by participating in our fundraising opportunities such as our summer Palisade peach sale, fall holiday wreath & butter braids sale, and RaiseRight program.

How is this income used?

The FRG helps fund all aspects of the program including instructors for marching band to jazz band, winter percussion, winter guard, and concert band. Also included in the expenses that FRGs cover are music licensing, show design, uniforms, marching band props and equipment, instrument purchase and repair, transportation to competitions and football games, band events, and much more!

Are there additional costs associated with the Legacy Band Program?

Costs vary depending on the student's section. Families are responsible for: marching band bundle, band polo or color guard tracksuit, marching or color guard shoes, percussion equipment, winter percussion and winter guard fees, and honor band registration & hotels.

How are finances tracked?

The Legacy Band Program uses an online financial tracker for each student called [CutTime](#). The CutTime student ledger shows your FRG, other assigned costs, fundraising profits, and payments.

What if I have excess funds in my CutTime Student Ledger?

Excess funds in a student ledger can be used to make payments for any required band purchases including student polos, dinkles, and more. Please email finance@legacybands.org to receive assistance making these payments or for more information.

Any excess funds will rollover to the next school year as long as the student is registered for band or color guard. Excess funds from a graduating senior or student not continuing band will be donated to the trip scholarship fund. If you would like to transfer excess funds to a sibling, please email finance@legacybands.org before the end of the school year.

Can our family receive financial aid to offset expenses?

The Legacy Band Boosters is committed to making this program accessible to ALL students, regardless of financial situation. Financial need is addressed on a case-by-case basis. Please contact Dr. Ebert or the Finance Team (finance@legacybands.org) with questions or concerns.

Ways to make payments to Legacy Band Boosters:

- Pay directly through CutTime
- Pay through Zelle (pay to president@legacybands.org). If you use this payment method, please email finance@legacybands.org letting us know the name of the student and what the payment is for so it gets credited in your CutTime account.
- Make a payment by check or cash: Place payment in an envelope and include the student's name and what the payment is for. Make all checks payable to Legacy Band Boosters. There are two ways to deliver these payments:
 1. Your student can place the payment in the band drop box located in the band room. (envelopes are available above the drop box)
 2. Mail the check to our PO Box.
